**IV. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION: Three (3) minutes per person up to 45 minutes of public comment on any agenda and non-agenda items.**

**Ken Stickle 118 Catherine Street** – Would like to know if the city can do anything with the ambulance company. They pull out of the garage on Upper Cottage Street, from the time they leave heading to College and Catherine and past the highway the sirens are above the point where it can damage hearing. On top of that every dog in the neighborhood are barking and it is annoying. It doesn't happen at 2pm but at 2am. The company is inconsiderate, and they are like a little boy on a big rig getting ready to blow the big horn. He would also like to challenge the Common Council, the Mayor and Corp. Counsel to come out and help clean up the City of Poughkeepsie, just bring a broom, a rake, anything. He is asking for one day a month to show support for the City of Poughkeepsie for the 3 months of the summer.

**Constantine Kazolias 47 Noxon Street** – The County is considering taking the Washington Street property where the computer is off the tax rolls. We can't afford to take any property off the tax roll. Also he is in favor of developing the Hoffman Street property. Also is impressed that the Democratic Party is endorsing a Republican. Further inquires where the suit from the division that owns all those properties, is it in the courts, or can you not comment? **V. MAYOR'S COMMENTS:**

**Mayor Tkazyik** – The Mayor extends a welcome to all present. And announced that this past weekend was the Father's Day Parade and it was a spectacular event. **ORDINANCE AMENDING §13-177(b) OF THE  
CITY OF POUGHKEEPSIE CODE OF ORDINANCES  
ENTITLED “LEFT TURNS PROHIBITED FOR ALL VEHICLES”  
(O-11-16)**

**INTRODUCED BY COUNCILMEMBER HERMAN**

**BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Common Council of the City of Poughkeepsie, as follows:

**SECTION 1:** Section 13-177(c) of the City of Poughkeepsie Code of Ordinances entitled “**Left turns prohibited 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.**” is amended by the following **ADDITION and Deletions**:

Left turns prohibited 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. **Monday through Friday**. When appropriate signs giving notice thereof are erected, left turns shall be prohibited at the following locations between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. on **Monday through Friday**:

[~~From the Financial Plaza parking deck to the south onto Civic Center Plaza~~]

**From Parker Avenue to the south on Washington Street**

**SECTION 2:** This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

**VII. PRESENTATION OF PETITIONS AND COMMUNICATIONS:**

- 1) **FROM ARMANIS, INC.**, a notice of intent to renew its Liquor License. **Referred to Corporation Counsel.**
- 2) **FROM GLEN F. KUBISTA & ASSOCIATES**, a notice of intent for the Poughkeepsie Tennis Club to renew its Liquor License. **Referred to Corporation Counsel.**
- 3) **FROM MARCIA SCHLOSSBERG**, a notice of property damage sustained on May 27, 2011. **Referred to Corporation Counsel.**

**X. UNFINISHED BUSINESS:**

**Councilman Coates** – Sometime last year the council voted to give city property to one of the homeowners on Noxon Street. He did not support that resolution, there was also Mr. Whitter, opened his building to the community. I have been told the property has not been transferred over. The homeowner is not interested anymore and would like to see the council vote to give this to Mr. Whitter.

**Councilwoman Solomon** - There was a transit oriented presentation last week. Hopes that there will be more presentations on the TOD because many missed since it was the first day of allowable petitioning. She is answered by Mayor Tkazyik that Councilman Praise was the only member able to attend. But in speaking to acom and metro north they will be presenting for the common council shortly.

**Councilwoman Flowers** – Wishes councilman Coates well as he moves onto the school board. Wants to thank the city for meeting with the neighborhood group CoST, capable of standing together. Thanks the PD for going over to Winnikee and assessing that situation over there with the shootings.

**Mayor Tkazyik** – Before the council is the Preliminary FEIS for 1 Dutchess Ave., the old Dutton lumber site. This application has provided responses to all comments that were received during the drafting and is in accordance with SEQR and will see this has a significantly revised plan. We would ask the council as lead agency to review what has been submitted to you and at the July 5<sup>th</sup> common council meeting there will be a presentation.

**Councilman Mallory** – On the issue of road repair, was curious on the roads of North Clinton Street and Garden Street. He is answered by the Mayor that the city did receive \$360,000 worth of NYS funds for street paving and repair. The administrator will provide a list of the projects that DPW deems necessary. The city is not borrowing any money to make sure these projects happen it is all done through state and federal funding.

**Councilwoman Johnson** – In the past each ward was given money for their ward, and then according to what was needed in the ward the priority took place. Now the city wants to prioritize across the entire city and not by within the wards. The Mayor answers that the days of operating in the past is behind us, and it is for that reason that the city had borrowed into oblivion. When we walked in here we faced a \$1.85 Million deficit because of the failed practices of the past that cannot and will not continue. Also that since a great job was done in the 5<sup>th</sup> ward she is hoping the police are dealing with South Grand. Additionally, has not received notification from citizen observer concerning the shootings last Friday.

**Councilwoman Flowers** - If Mobile Life took over the property on Persian Avenue, yet. She is answered that they have not, but they will close very shortly.

**Chairman Klein** – There had been a draft of the Historic Preservation ordinance that had been disseminated to the council for comment. And perhaps it could be voted on July 11<sup>th</sup>, after another public hearing is set. Secondly, would like to remind the council that on June 29<sup>th</sup> there will be a special meeting at 6pm for the election of a replacement for Mr. Coates.

**XI. NEW BUSINESS:**

**Councilman Mallory** – wants to make a motion to amend the 2010 CDBG action plan of reallocate \$175,000 to scattered sidewalks but instead to do \$165,000 towards that and the other \$10,000 to do a feasibility study on the armory to be our youth center, which would go to an architectural and engineer study to produce a current state of the building.

**Councilman Mallory makes a motion to allocate \$10,000 from the CDBG action plan to do a feasibility study on the Armory and is seconded by Councilwoman Mallory.**
